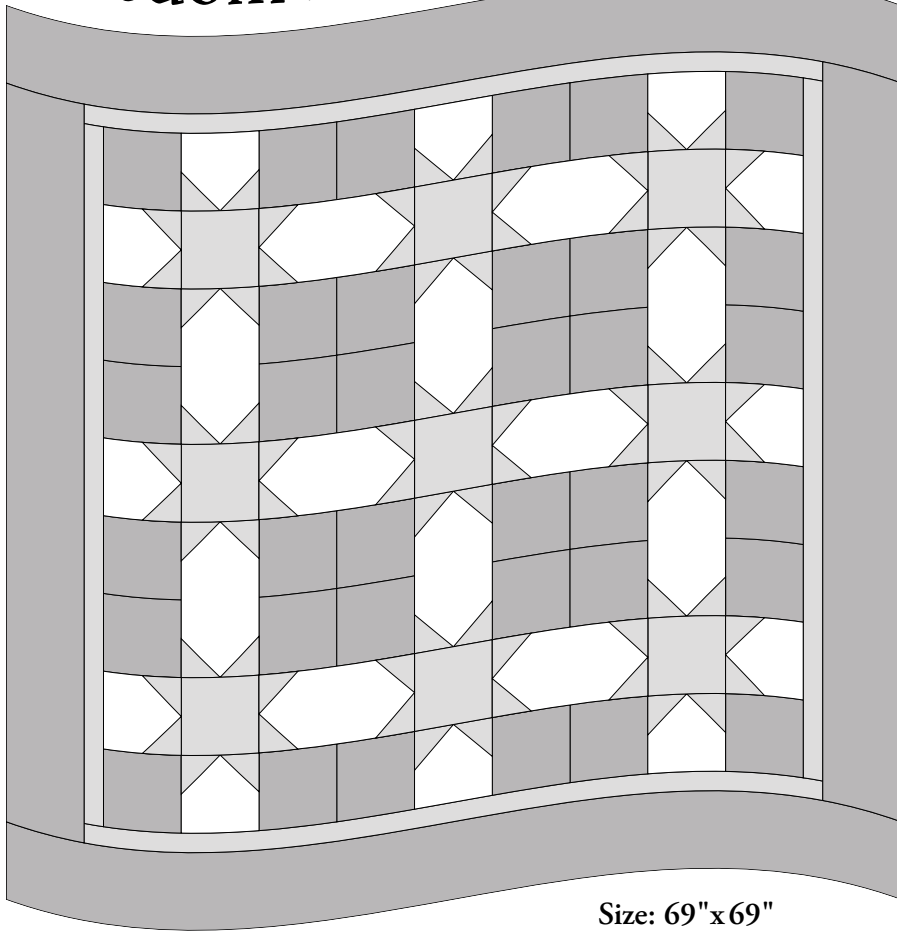


Freedom is Our Strength

Fabric requirements:

Blue	6 fat quarters
Red	5 fat quarters
Background	6-1/4 yards (9" x WOF)
Inner border	1/2 yard
Final border	1 1/2 yards
Binding	1/4 yard
Backing	5 1/2 yards

Cutting:

Blue fabric:

from EACH of 6 fat quarters cut:
 2-6 1/2" x 22"
 then 6-6 1/2" x 6 1/2"
 1-2 1/2" x 22" (binding)

Red fabric:

from EACH of 4 fat quarters cut:
 1-6 1/2" x 22"
 then 3-6 1/2" x 6 1/2"
 2-3 1/2" x 22"
 then 12-3 1/2" x 3 1/2"
 1-2 1/2" x 22" (binding)
 from one fat quarter cut:
 4-3 1/2" x 22"
 then 24-3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

Background fabric:

from EACH of 6 quarter yards cut:
 1-6 1/2" x WOF
 then 2-6 1/2" x 12 1/2"
 2-6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

Inner border:

8-2" x WOF

Final border:

7-6 1/2" x WOF

Binding:

add to the red and blue binding strips
 cut 3-2 1/2" x WOF

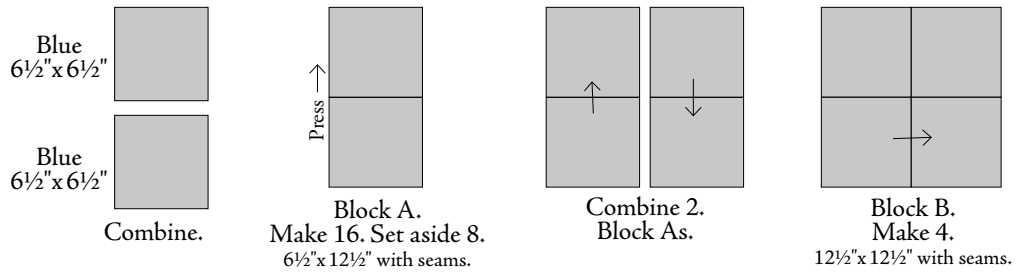

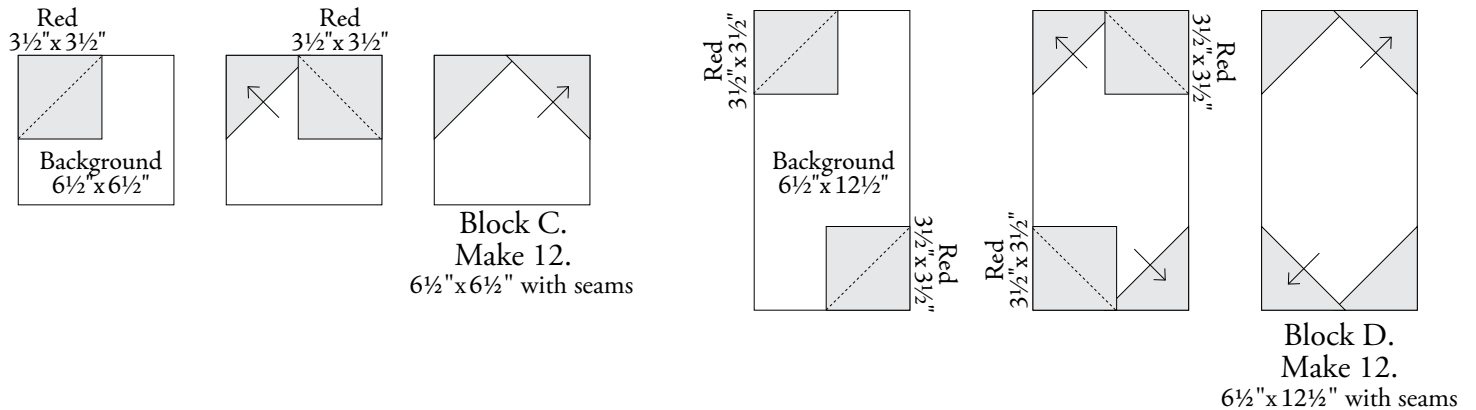

- 1** Sew $2-6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ blue squares together. Make 16 Block As. Set aside 8. Sew two Block As together to make Block B. Make 4 Block Bs.

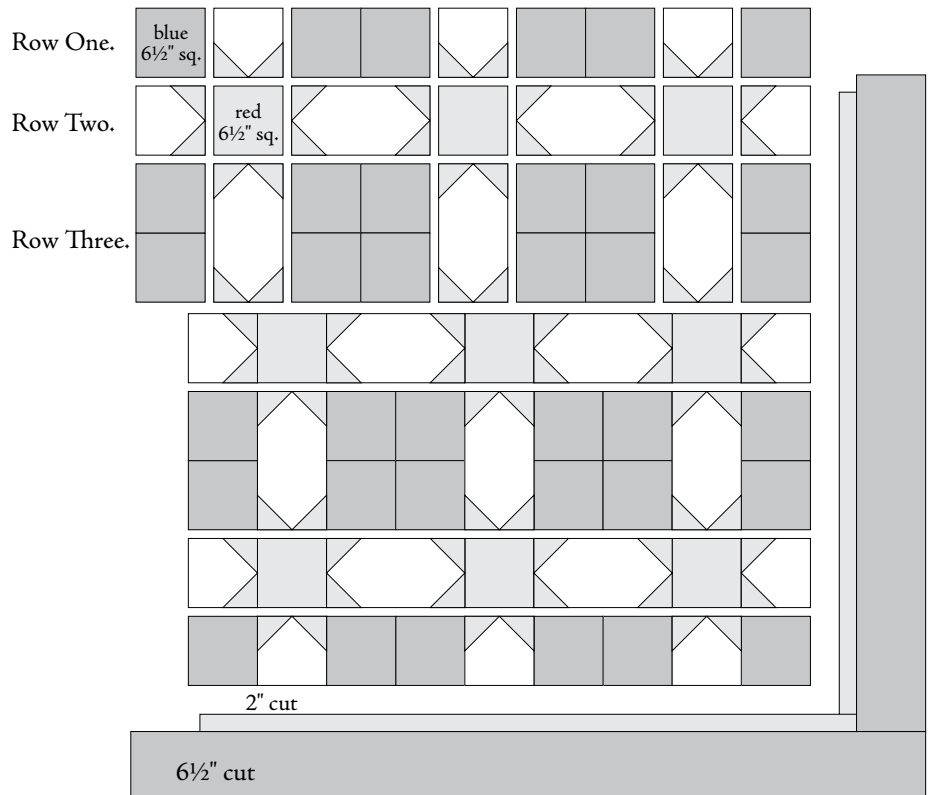


- 2** Easy corner triangles are used to make Blocks C & D. Sew $1-3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ red square on the diagonal to $1-6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ background square. Press to the corner to make the triangle. To the same background square sew another $3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ red square on the diagonal. Press to the corner. Make 12 Block Cs. Using the same process sew $4-3\frac{1}{2}'' \times 3\frac{1}{2}''$ red squares on the diagonal to $1-6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}''$ background rectangle. Make 12 Block Ds.



- 3** Three different rows make up the quilt top. *Look at the diagram for placement.* For Row One, sew $2-6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ blue squares, 2 Block As and 3 Block Cs together. Make 2 Row Ones. For Row Two, sew $3-6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$ red squares, 2 Block Cs and 2 Block Ds together. Make 3 Row Twos. For Row Three, sew 2 Block As, 2 Block Bs and 3 Block Ds together. Make 2 Row Threes. Press towards the blue squares. Sew the rows together.

- 4** Add the 2" inner borders, sides first then top and bottom. Measure across the center of the quilt for the best length for the borders. Add the $6\frac{1}{2}''$ final borders, sides first then top and bottom. Measure across the center of the quilt for the best length for the borders. Layer, quilt as desired and bind.
